Sue Rosser, who provided exemplary leadership as Dean of the Ivan Allen College of Liberal Arts for 10 years, stepped down this summer to become Provost at San Francisco State University. The President and Provost of Georgia Tech announce a nationwide search for a successor who can lead the College to continued prominence and accomplishment.

The Ivan Allen College is a liberal arts college set within a premier technological university that is ranked the 7th best public university in the nation in the most recent *US News & World Report* ratings. The College's academic programs are internationally acclaimed as models for liberal arts education in a technological age. Ivan Allen offers broad-based interdisciplinary study in the humanities and social sciences. The College is renowned for innovative programs that explore science, technology, and computing through the lens of the liberal arts, and for its rigorous graduate and professional programs.

Reporting to the Provost, the Dean of the Ivan Allen College is the chief academic and administrative officer of the College and holds the position of Ivan Allen Dean's Chair. The Dean will provide the overall strategic direction for the College, with particular focus on the faculty's aspiration to define a new generation of liberal arts through the research and educational initiatives of the College's schools. It is anticipated that the new Dean will provide strong leadership and an innovative, forward-looking vision for the faculty of the College. The selected candidate will continue and to expand upon the College's interdisciplinary approach, which pursues collaborative research and education with partners in a variety of disciplines.
